The school has signed up to an online resource called “MyMaths.co.uk.”

MyMaths.co.uk allows the school to have fun interactive lessons both in class and at home!

Teachers are able to set homework for students to complete at home. One of the great features of this resource is that it marks the homework instantly and therefore gives feedback to each child. Children have a chance to give feedback to their class teacher and vice-versa.

Parents can track how well their child is doing in their online homework on “MyMaths” by logging into their child’s account.

We believe we are one of the first, if not the first Islamic Primary School to have this resource at our disposal. Many children and parents have already made positive comments, *Alhamdulillah*.

EYFS News

It has been an exciting time for most children in Reception class. They have enjoyed making new friends and also seeing some familiar faces from the Noor Ul Islam Pre-School.

KS1 and KS2 News

Year 1 and 2 have been learning about many different facts in their classrooms.

Year 1 have looked at old and new toys for their History lessons and will be going on an educational visit to the “Childhood Museum.”. Year 2 have been learning about “Florence Nightingale” in their History lessons and they will also have a chance to visit the Florence Nightingale museum.

There will be a Prefect system at Noor Ul Islam Primary School soon Insha’Allah. At present the year 6 students are in the process of going through the Prefect job descriptions and deciding which job they feel would best suit their character. Once decided they will have to make a formal application to Ust. Idris. Depending on what they have written in their application form, Ust. Idris’s judgment and also any history of good/bad behaviour, we will formally hand out the roles.

Shortly, we will be introducing a tuck shop to KS2 breaks. One of the prefects will also have the key role of “Tuck Shop Supervisor.” The profits from the tuck shop will be used to sponsor an Orphan. All products from the tuck shop will have a healthy element, Insha’Allah.
